

**JOINT WAIVER AGREEMENT
Netherlands Antilles / Aruba
AN / AW**



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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this order

This order describes the joint waiver agreement between the AW and AN division for air traffic control procedures and functions of Curacao FIR and Juliana TMA. The guidelines and agreement contained herein shall be followed as outlined unless otherwise coordinated.

1.2 Audience

This order applies to all ATC users and anyone using ATC directives.

1.4 What this order cancels

1.5 Explanation of changes

1.6 Distribution

This order is intended for use by ATC of either division and holders of an AN or AW Guest Controller Approval (GCA). Users of any outstanding division are still required to obtain an AN or AW Guest Controller Approval (GCA).

2 Waiver Agreement

2.1 Intended purpose

This agreement is to allow the following:

- A) Members of the Aruba and Netherlands Antilles divisions are allowed to control any facility inside the Curacao FIR and/or Juliana TMA, without the need for a GCA from either division.
- B) Holders of an AW GCA are allowed to control any facility inside the Curacao FIR and/or Juliana TMA, without the need for a GCA from the Netherlands Antilles division.
- C) Holders of an AN GCA are allowed to control any facility inside the Aruba TMA, without the need for a GCA from the Aruba division.

2.2 Procedures

Controllers of each Division should familiar themselves of the differences before manning any facility. Although both regions are within the Netherlands Kingdom and uses EASA safety regulatory standards and procedures, local procedures can be different.
